



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Statistics



Estimate: Between 65 to 80 percent of the world's population (over 4 billion people) rely on alternative medicine as their primary form of health care compared to only 10 to 30 percent of people who use conventional medicine.



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Researchers estimate:

Complementary and alternative medicine (CAM) has grown rapidly over the last two decades and is now used by around six million people a year (UK)

Britons spend £130m a year on complementary treatments and it is estimated this will exceed more than £200m over the next four years

Findings from Cancer Research UK Surveys

Researchers estimate:

30 to 40 out of every 100 people (30-40%) with cancer use complementary and alternative medicine (CAM)

Huddersfield University pilot study (2015) concluded:

"Researchers feel that Reiki, as a Complementary therapy, should be available to cancer sufferers on the NHS"

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Findings from a YouGov Survey (2015)

Many people – in several cases a firm majority – remain positive about the effectiveness of alternative medicines. Even for treatments with no scientific or professional recognition, public opinion is divided at worst.

WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST



Canine Massage

Requires a vet's referral or consent 2 year training: Canine Massage Guild

The dog's gait and posture will be assessed as it is gently moved or walked.

A full body palpitation then helps to identify areas of tenderness, injury, the tonicity of the muscle, its temperature and also its state.

The treatment then consists of a blend of three main types of deep tissue massage. Improvement is generally seen in 3 sessions.






WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

Commonly quoted benefits

- Relaxes muscle and reduces tension
- Improves muscle tone
- Releases Trigger Points
- Breaks down knots which inhibit movement
- Improves the flow of toxins and waste away from muscles
- Reduces inflammation
- Aids with areas of overcompensation
- Improves flexibility and range of joint motion which may benefit comfort and performance
- Promotes the body's natural healing process
- Promotes a healthy skin and coat





WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

Consequently conditions it may help:

- Stiffness
- Soreness/ aches & pains
- Mobility issues/ gait irregularities
- Back / Neck / Hip issues
- Poor agility performance eg: weave entry, measuring, knocking poles
- Recovery from exercise, injury and operations




Canine Massage also supports a number of Orthopaedic conditions such as Arthritis, Hip & Elbow Dysplasia, Luxating Patella and Spondylosis





WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST



Canine Bowen Therapy

Requires a vet's referral or consent Training: European Guild of Canine Bowen Therapists

Fingers and thumbs are applied to specific soft-tissue points on the dog's body via slow, gentle rolling movements with very gentle pressure so as to just disturb the underlying tissue and create a focus for the brain to work on.

The moves are interspersed with short pause, allowing the dog's brain and body to process what is happening, causing fine adjustments in the dog's body.

Results normally be seen after 2 to 3 sessions.


Commonly quoted conditions it may help

- Acute injury sprains & strains
- Arthritis & muscular problems
- Skin conditions & allergies
- Stress & anxiety
- Lameness & problems moving
- Back problems; hip & elbow dysplasia
- Respiratory conditions
- Aggression & behavioural problems
- Chronic illness/ degenerative disease improving quality of life
- Relaxation of tension from previous trauma,
 e.g. rescue / re-homed dogs





WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST



Reiki

No vet's referral or consent required Training: The Reiki Experience (human training is required first) Est. 1 year +

Reiki is given hands-on, hands-off or distantly after a brief medical history.

Many animals seem to understand/ welcome the energy.

Supports orthodox veterinary care and can be given in conjunction with other complementary therapies.

Commonly quoted benefits

- Relaxing and calming
- Enhanced feeling of well being
- Improved sense of self
- Reduced stress/ anxiety
- Reduction in pain and discomfort
- Promotion of the body's natural healing process
- Enhances recovery from illness, injury and surgery
- Greater comfort
- Improved mobility



Case study – Vet's Practice

Case study – Dog Rescue

WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

Recent research had shown that hands on therapies like Reiki, T Touch and massage can reduce the stress hormone cortisol, in dogs and increase the oxytocin, known as the 'tend and befriend' hormone.

This hormone seems to make dogs (and humans) more trusting and friendly and may help reactive dogs to be calmer in the situations they find challenging.


Animal Communication

- This skill allows you to share two way feelings with animals
- Understand how they feel pre and post therapy
- Excellent for behavioural issues/ comprehend their issues
- A means to converse with animals to help them 'as they wish to be helped'

WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

Acupuncture*



* Must be conducted by a Vet

- Acupuncture may be defined as the insertion of needles into specific points on the body to produce a healing response
- Each acupuncture point has specific actions when stimulated
- Used in veterinary practice in China for thousands of years to treat many ailments
- May help functional problems such as those that involve paralysis, inflammation and pain
- Also physical conditions incl. skin, muscle, bone, reproductive, GI & neurological



WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

Aromatherapy* & Zoopharmacognosy



* Must be conducted by a Vet

- Enable self-selection of preferred essential oils/ plants extracts for medicinal purposes
- Use an animal's inherent ability to select what they need in the wild
- The oils & extracts contain hundreds of the constituents like those in an animal's natural environment
- May help restore balance & promote physical,
 psychological & emotional wellbeing




WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

(Bachs) Flower Remedies





- 38 remedies discovered by Dr Bach
- Each relates to a specific emotional and mental state
- Treat the individual, not the disease or the disease symptoms
- Work specifically on the emotional condition of the animal








WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST



Homeopathy*

- Based on the principle 'let like be cured by likes' ie. a substance taken in small amounts will cure the symptoms caused by large amounts
- It may benefit physical & emotional areas eg
 - dermatitis & arthritis
 - cats: renal failure, over-grooming & hyperthyroidism
 - dogs: pyoderma (a bacterial infection of the skin) & colitis, fear







WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

Reiki training for example Level 1 – intense weekend: Develop your ability and practice. Case studies

Level 2 – another intense weekend: Theory about animal Reiki, Practice hours and case studies

Level 1& 2 Animal Reiki – understanding animals: body language, behaviour, handling, anatomy & physiology (as part of an animal reiki or other animal care course(s). Also additional Reiki techniques **ARS**





WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

Complementary and Natural Healthcare Council (CNHC) UK register

- √ 16 therapies
- ✓ Requires additional training and/ or 3 years professional experience
- Overseen by the General Medical Practice
- ✓ Approved by The Professional Standards Authority for Health & Social Care
- Enables GP referrals to registered practitioners





WHERE ANIMALS ALWAYS COME FIRST

Animal Health Practitioners Register (AHPR)

- UK register of accredited animal health practitioners to launch 2018
- Initial focus musculo skeletal therapies
- Provide credibility of professional standards
- To be an all encompassing Register for animal health practitioners
- Enable vets to refer animals for complementary therapy
